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Entry Requirements



There are no pre-requisites for this course aside from a proficiency in Language, Literacy and Numeracy, to a minimum of ACSF level 3.

On enrolment, students will be asked to apply for both a National Police Clearance and Working with Children Check. These forms can be requested from our Training Administration Team.

Following industry standards, students will be required to provide proof of vaccination records and obtain a current flu vaccination.

Eligibility



All applications will be assessed by the My Flex Training Enrolment Officer on a case by case basis.

Students will be required to submit valid forms of photo ID, proof of citizenship / residency / visa status and also complete a student enrolment form.

You are eligible for the course if you have left school, your primary place of residence is in Western Australia and you are:

- an Australian citizen;
- a permanent visa holder;
- a holder of visa subclass 309, 444, 785, 790, 820 or 826;
- secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 457;
- Holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or 790.

Course Fees



Tuition fees for the HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance (Assisting in Nursing Work in Acute Care) are government subsidised as part of the Jobs and Skills WA Program.

Course fees are based on approved funding from the Department of Training and Workforce Development at the time of student enrolment. Funding Criteria applies.
